

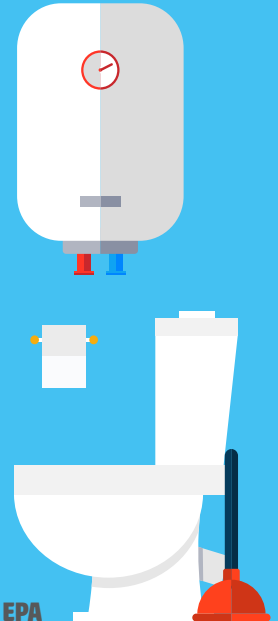
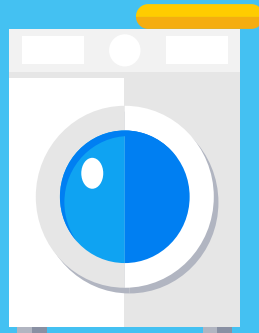
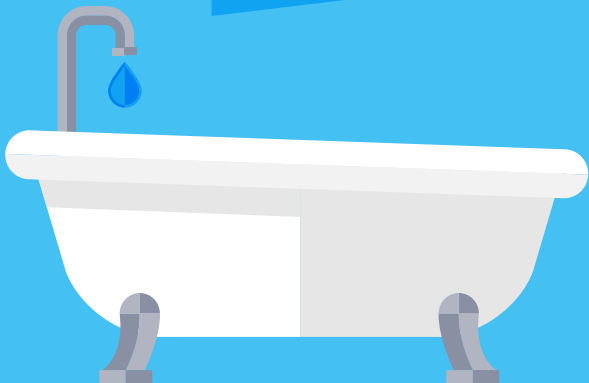

Ten percent of U.S. homes have leaks that waste 90 gallons of water or more per day.



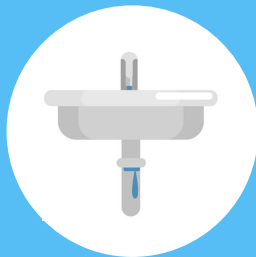

Why Should I Fix Leaks?



A running toilet can waste more than 200 gallons of water per day.

A new flapper can often stop the leak. Cost? \$5.



One leaky faucet can waste up to 3,000 gallons of water per year.

That adds up to approximately 80 showers.



Going out for a few hours? Check the meter before you leave and when you return. If the meter is not the same, you probably have a leak.



Save at least 10% on your water bill by fixing leaks.
