### **City of Dana Point Adopts Resolution to Hold General Municipal Election to Fill Three Council Seats in Districts 1, 2 and 3**

**Dana Point, CA (June 25, 2018)** -- On June 19, the City of Dana Point moved forward on holding a general municipal election on November 6, 2018 to fill three council seats in Districts 1, 2 and 3. The Council adopted the three necessary resolutions by a 4 to 1 vote.

The City Council adopted the following three resolutions:

- A. A resolution of the City Council of the City of Dana Point, California, calling for the holding of a general municipal election to be held on Tuesday, November 6, 2018 for the election of certain officers as required by the provisions of the laws of the State of California relating to general law cities; and
  
- B. A resolution of the City Council of the City of Dana Point, California, requesting the Board of Supervisors of the County of Orange to consolidate a general municipal election to be held on November 6, 2018 with the statewide general election to be held on the date pursuant to Section 10403 of the election code, and:

- C. A resolution of the City Council of the City of Dana Point, California, adopting regulations for candidates for elective office pertaining to candidate's statement submitted to the voters at an election to be held on Tuesday, November 6, 2018.

On May 15, the City of Dana Point adopted a five-district, by district method of election system and sequence for City Council elections. A by-district election process means voters within a designated City Council electoral district elect one City Council member who must also reside in and be a registered voter of that district.
